

### Summer One Theme - Wonderful West Midlands

#### English

*Through storytelling, role-play, art and reading both for pleasure and within comprehension we will explore Little Red Riding Hood and other traditional tales.*

- Daily phonics, handwriting, spelling, punctuation, and grammar activities.
- Create character profiles and write recounts, leaflets, stories.
- Explore prefixes, suffixes, compound words, nouns, verbs and adjectives.

#### Maths

Throughout our maths lessons this half term we are going to be looking at doubling/halving, multiplication, measurement, and coin recognition. We will also continue developing our knowledge of place value up to 100.

#### Science

We will observe plants and begin to think of them as living things which grow and change over time. We will observe common features, similarities and differences between plants and will learn about the basic structure of a variety of common flowering plants, including trees.

#### History / Geography

*Through map reading including Google earth/ videos/ walks out of school/ educational visit and song.*

- Identify places in the West Midlands.
- Visit places virtually and physically. Identify features/ landmarks.
- Identify our favourite places- data handling.
- Make models/ maps/ adverts/ leaflets.
- Compare places through pictures/ diagrams/ cutting and sticking activities.
- Plan improvements to a local area/ place.
- Compare a local favourite place to e.g. Peru (a non-European place).

#### Design Technology

Children will understand and use principles of a healthy and varied diet to design, prepare and evaluate food suitable for a summer picnic. Children will have the opportunity to make food they have designed and taste the food!

#### Music

Through fairy tales, children are introduced to the concept of timbre; learning that different sounds can represent characters and key moments in a story. They explore clapping along to the syllables of words and phrases before creating rhythmic patterns to tell a familiar fairy tale.
