If you are considering Worfield Endowed for your child, Please ask Mrs Taggart for a 'Prospective Parent Pack' and to schedule a school tour.

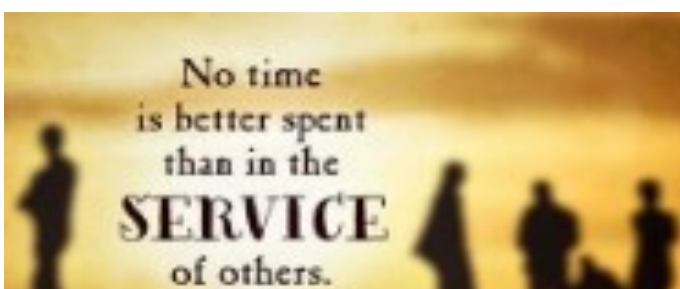


Children can start school in our Reception Class at the beginning of the academic year following their fourth birthday. Therefore, children born between 1 September 2018 and 31 August 2019 can start primary school from September 2023.

## **Free School Meals**

If you're financial situation has changed you may be entitled to free school meals. You can check your eligibility online at

### **Who qualifies for government free school meals?**

Free school meals are available to pupils in receipt of, or whose parents are in receipt of, one or more of the following benefits:

Universal credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods)

- Income support
- Income-based jobseeker's allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guarantee element of pension credit
- Child tax credit (provided you're not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working tax credit run-on – paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for working tax credit.

If you're child is eligible they do not have to have a free school meal but they would be entitled to a reduction in the cost of residential school visits and may be entitled to remissions for other school activities in accordance with the school's Charging and Remission Policy.
