Dear Parent,

**KS2 SATS:**

As another academic year draws to a close I would like to take this opportunity to share with you our school's recent Key Stage 2 SATS results. Our current Year 6 class have achieved results which are above national outcomes in all subject areas. In Maths 83% of children achieved the expected standard, nationally the figure was 75%. In Reading 79% of children achieved the expected standard, nationally the figure was 71%, and in Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling 79% of children achieved the expected standard compared to 77% nationally. In Writing 83% of our children achieved the expected standard compared to 76% nationally. These are great results for our pupils and it is down to hard work from the children and staff and the continuing support we receive from parents and our governing body.

The SATs are of course just one measure of how a child is progressing and they do not take into account all the many other strengths and talents of each individual child. I am extremely proud of how well every child in Year 6 has progressed during their time at Worfield. We have some marvellous musicians, some super sportsmen and women, talented dancers, artists, actors and computer programmers to name but a few! Our Year 6 pupils, who will be leaving Worfield School on 21st July, are well prepared to begin the next stage in their educational journey and we wish them every success.

**Changes to our cloakrooms:**

In response to pupil requests and to further improve fire safety, over the summer break we will be having lockers installed in the KS1 corridor and the cloakroom area outside our Year 4 and next year's Year 5 classrooms. The Safer School committee have been instrumental in helping us to choose the right lockers and they have done tests to check that the locker is big enough to hold each child's belongings. The Safer School committee reported back to me that they were surprised at just how much they could fit in a single locker; PE kit, coat, book bag, school bag, wellies and more! I wanted to give you advanced notice that we were having the lockers as you may wish to consider the size of school bag your child uses next term, especially if you are intending on purchasing a new one ready for September. We currently have a sample of the locker in school and this will be shown to all children so that they can understand the space that will be available for their belongings from September. Children will have a name plate on their locker. The lockers have a twist handle and no keys, so there won't be lost keys to worry about! I know the children in Years 1-5 are really excited to be the first year to have lockers. There will still be some pegs for children to hang their forest school clothes on after a session if their clothes are wet or muddy.

May I also take this opportunity to remind parents of our uniform expectations before money is spent buying new clothing or shoes for September. All items of school uniform should be named.

Boys' Uniform

White shirt (white polo shirt with school badge for summer if preferred); school tie; grey trousers (or grey shorts in the summer months); grey socks; bottle green V-necked sweatshirt with school badge; black or brown plain shoes (not trainers).

Girls' Uniform

White blouse; school tie; knee-length grey skirt, pinafore dress or grey tailored trousers (not stretch), (green and white gingham or striped dress for summer if preferred); grey or white socks; bottle green V-necked sweatshirt or cardigan with school badge; black or brown plain shoes with sensible low heels (please note that high heels present a health and safety risk).

Parents are reminded that extreme hairstyles are not permitted at school. Details regarding this and other aspects of our uniform expectations are in our uniform policy which can be found in the policies section of the school's website.

Term ends for children at 3pm on Friday 21st July. Children return to school on Tuesday 5th September.
